Why Children inside of Parliament?

- What is democracy?

 How do children's voices, interests, concerns fare?

The challenge of representing children in Parliament

- Children do not vote
- Children do not contribute \$\$\$
- Children vary in age, ability, preference, etc.
- Children do not form a clear electoral constituency
- Most societies do not accord children a space for expression in the political sphere
- How do we know what children think or prefer or would want?
- Do politicians have incentives to listen to children?

Benefits of bringing children's voices or perspectives into Parliament

Improved Outcomes for ALL

- More democratic and representative
- Longer term perspective
- Improved legislative outcomes
- Promotes civic education and citizenship

The Convention on the Rights of the Child

Children's Political Rights

- Article 12 right to participation in all matters affecting the child
- Article 13 freedom of expression
- Article 15 freedom of association and assembly

Mechanisms for bringing children into Parliament

- Parliamentary Committees (Standing and Ad Hoc)
- Plenary Discussions
- Parliamentary Caucuses
- Party Groups
- Budget Process
- Children's Ombudsperson (Norway as great example)

Bringing Parliamentarians to children

- National or subnational consultations
- Constituency relations
- Field visits to institutions that host children
- Information and communication technology and social media

Guiding Principles

- Sustainability
- Participation is NOT substitution
- Risk of politicization
- Equity
- Protection and security
- Accountability
- Selection

Making Parliament receptive to children

- Partnerships with relevant NGOs, youth clubs, UNICEF, and other relevant stakeholders
- Access to child-relevant research and data
- Student visits to parliament
- Children's parliaments
